
A Parent's Guide to Response to Intervention (RTI)

What is RTI?

RTI is a multi-tier approach designed to identify, support, and monitor the progress of students who may be at risk for learning or behavior challenges.

Who Does RTI Serve?

RTI is an educational initiative for **all** students, including those at risk, students with language differences, and students with disabilities.



Reasons Families and Communities Support RTI

- Schools do not have to wait for students to fail before helping.
- Students receive additional instruction in a smaller group, often with their peers.
- Teachers communicate precise information with family and with decisionmakers.

Questions Families Might Ask About RTI

- What information is used to identify my child's needs?
- Who will provide the intervention instruction?
- What will my child miss if he or she receives an intervention?
- How does the school determine whether my child needs Tier 2 or Tier 3 supports?
- If my child is falling behind, will I be contacted? How often?
- How can I be involved in the RTI process?
